DESCRIPTION:

A Heavy Equipment Operator/ Driver is responsible for the service, maintenance and operation of all tribally owned Heavy Equipment and vehicles, as well as any machinery or tools that need to be rented or leased to accomplish any tasks required by specific jobs. Persons meeting the minimum qualifications must be able to work independently as well as with co-workers.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Perform daily inspection of all equipment before use
- Insure that regular maintenance is performed and is documented
- Comply with all safety policies of the tribe and state
- Insure proper usage of all machinery, equipment and tools per their intended use
- Welding and fabrication
- Basic mechanical work
- Some woodworking
- Chainsaw operation and maintenance including safe tree felling

All duties and responsibilities are subject to change

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

- High School Diploma or a GED equivalent
- Possession of a valid State drivers and class A or B CDL
- Experience in measuring and estimating of materials

Bi-yearly random drug tests will be required and any traffic violations civil or criminal must be reported to your supervisor and or fleet manager immediately. Failure to comply will be grounds for termination.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATION:

- Knowledge of basic maintenance of heavy equipment
- Ability to read blueprints
- Knowledge of hydraulic systems, air brakes and other heavy equipment related systems
- Experience with pipefitting, ditch digging, road and other large construction projects
- Ability to work independently and effectively
- Ability to manage time and meet all specified deadlines
- Able to understand and implement all assigned tasks
- Ability to comprehend all policies and procedures of LVD
- Knowledge of DOT, state, and tribal safety procedures and guidelines as it pertains to equipment and site specific applications
- Certified in CPR and first aid
